Brief Role Statement	<p>This is a Voluntary position</p> <p>The Region Commissioner Joey Scouts will lead their Region Joey Scout Council (Wandarrah) which is empowered to support the program of Scouting which is delivered at the Region level and by Groups in sections.</p> <p>The Region Commissioner Joey Scouts is a member of the Region Team and will be called upon by the Region Commissioner to assist with Region initiatives.</p>
Primary Responsibilities within the Region	<p>Ensure that they and the District Leaders (if applicable) work to: -</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Understand and know what is happening at Mob level. • Encourage leaders to hold Mob Sleepovers, and a Mob Holiday at least once a year. • Encourage leaders to hold Mob Councils at least once a term. • Monitor, track and respond to supports. <p>Quality Program Delivery</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ensure that Joey Scouts are provided with a quality program to engage them and meet their development needs which entices full participation. <p>Award Scheme</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Encourage participation in the Joey Scout Award Scheme with the target of increasing the percentage of youth who achieve each level of the award scheme, including the Joey Scout Promise Challenge <p>Development</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Develop the skills and capacity of leaders to deliver the program within the Joey Scout section • Support the Region Commissioner and Group Leaders on recruitment of new Joey Scout Leaders and the establishment of New Joey Scout Mobs • Support and lead new initiatives to develop the Association and the Section • Mentor members of your Region and ensure that they have training for their role. <p>Communication.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Encourage Joey Scouts and their activities in Scouting and outside communities. • Visit each mob at least once a term in their own environment if possible or District Leader. • Attend Region Team meetings monthly. • Pass information received from State and Region to all Joey Leaders regardless as to your view
Primary Responsibilities within State Joey Council	<p>Be the eyes and ears of the Joey State Commissioner, bringing attention to any necessary items or issues that the Joey leaders feel are important to the running of their Joey mobs and the Joeys in their charge.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Responding to emails in a timely manner • Regularly reporting as requested regarding the Joey Mobs in the region • Regularly attending State Commissioners meeting. • Help plan and run any State activity ie Konara <p>Facilitate</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Encourage a process through the Districts/Regions to the Joey Scout Mobs that is proactive support that will enable all leaders to develop the program • To be open, honest and timely • Hold regular Wandarrahs to which part must have an ongoing training segment

	<p>Membership</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Be a member and regular attendee of the State Joey Council. • Be part of the selection process for District leaders in discussion with the District Commissioner (if applicable) • Coaching/Mentoring • Mentor members of your region and ensure that they have training for their role. <p>Communication.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Encourage Joey Scouts and their activities in Scouting and outside communities. • Visit each mob at least once a term in their own environment if possible or District Leader Pass information received from State to all Joey Leaders regardless as to your view
<p>Skills and Qualities</p>	<p>Attitude</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Be enthusiastic with a strong commitment to Scouting Principles and the importance of the Scout method in delivering the program • Have a commitment towards the importance of activities and the 'out' in Scouting • Be inclusive in leadership style encouraging their teams to excel • Be respectful of all their team accepting individual differences as a resource • Work with the Region Office regarding processes, accounts etc <p>Skills</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Be able to lead, communicate with and motivate adult leaders and work harmoniously to grow the program • Must have good written and verbal communication skills • Demonstrate planning and delegation skills <p>Knowledge</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Have a sound knowledge and strong commitment to the aims, objectives and philosophy of the Scout Movement, its policies and procedures and have a clear understanding of the methods which make it distinctive from other youth organizations • Understand and demonstrate the role and responsibilities of Region Commissioner Joey Scouts and have a commitment to that role • Hold or be willing to complete a Wood Badge • Have completed advanced training in the Joey Scout Section • Be prepared to complete advanced Leader of Adult training within twelve months of appointment
